1. Summary Tables of additional Reception Class place demand

1.1 BOROUGH LEVEL: the tables below summarise the additional Reception Class place demand over the next 4 years, and the schools where increases in pupil numbers are proposed to be accommodated.

1.2 The following paragraphs set out the need for additional Reception Places in each Township, together with the agreed proposals for meeting that need. It should be noted that:

- the projections do not include any additional place need arising from the effect of any new housing developments,
- it is assumed that all existing Reception places will be filled, and
- wherever possible, to help compliance with class size legislation, additional places are proposed on the basis of a whole form of entry (30 places), or in some cases a half form of entry (15 places).

3. School Organisation Plan Update 2010-14

A stakeholder group comprising elected members, school representatives (headteachers and governors), trades unions and diocesan representatives was set up to look at the supply and demand for primary and secondary school places.
